Considerable Fee Differences

A quick analysis of how much it costs to pursue a building permit in neighboring counties.

- In Klickitat County it costs a total of \$725 of EH fees to develop raw land for on-site sewage use and potable water.
 - \$275 – site eval
 - \$350 – permit fee
 - \$50 – application for water availability review
 - \$30 – for a bacterial analysis
 - \$20 – for a nitrate analysis

- In Adams County, it costs a total of \$700 plus 60/ hr for water review.
 - \$500 - new permit
 - \$200 - soil and site eval
 - Water Review 60/hr

- In Pacific County it would cost \$995.
 - \$400 - site eval
 - \$240 - installation permit
 - \$240 - design review
 - \$115 annual O&M permit

- In Jefferson County it would cost \$1,413.
 - \$619 - permit fee
 - \$431 - site eval
 - \$223 - water application
 - \$140 - supply determination
 - \$140 - to review your building permit application

- Grant County costs \$1,203.
 - \$822 - permit fee
 - \$119 - site final
 - \$77 - site visit
 - \$103 - WAV
 - \$82 - bacteria sample

- In Asotin County it costs \$935, assuming it took only 1 hour to do the design review and site eval (unlikely)
 - \$50 - oss application
 - \$95/hr - site evaluation
 - \$95/hr - design review
 - \$95 - final site visit
 - \$450 - new permit
 - \$150 - water evaluation
 - Lab fees not included

The changes to food permitting bump the prices up slightly while eliminating unnecessary classifications. We removed the classification that included sewer or OSS. We have simplified it to just complexity level of the menu being served.

For the comparison with other counties, Harvest Market in White Salmon was chosen for this example.

- For Harvest Market to operate in Klickitat County it costs \$400
 - For them to operate in Grant County it would cost \$764
 - \$190 - grocery permit
 - \$200 - add service
 - \$109 - add produce
 - \$109 - add meat cutting/prep
 - \$109 - add bakery
 - \$47 - add bulk foods
 - For them to operate in Jefferson County it would cost \$510
 - \$510 - level 3 operating permit
 - For Pacific County, \$480
 - \$240 - level 3 operating permit
 - \$240 - 0 to 25 seats
 - For Adams County, \$450
 - \$255 - Grocery
 - \$65 - add deli
 - \$65 - add bakery
 - \$65 - add meat cutting
 - For Asotin County, \$710
 - \$270 - grocery 3-5 checkstands
 - \$100 - add bakery
 - \$100 - add espresso
 - \$100 - add meat cutting
 - \$140 -add complex deli
