SIXTH REVISED AND EXTENDED EMERGENCY ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

WHEREAS, on February 29, 2020, Governor Inslee proclaimed a state of emergency due to the novel coronavirus disease (COVID-19) outbreak in Washington; and on March 13, 2020, President Trump declared a national emergency due to the COVID-19 outbreak across the United States; and

WHEREAS, during this state of emergency, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention and the Washington State Department of Health have recommended increasingly stringent social distancing measures of at least six feet between people, and encouraged vulnerable individuals to avoid public spaces; and

WHEREAS, consistent with these recommendations, Governor Inslee issued and extended a "Stay Home, Stay Healthy" order directing non-essential businesses to

close, banning public gatherings, and requiring Washingtonians to stay home except to pursue essential activities; and

WHEREAS, on May 31, 2020, Governor Inslee issued his Safe Start proclamation allowing a phased reopening process for counties while requiring that counties take necessary steps to ensure public safety as they progress through the stages of reopening; and

WHEREAS, many court facilities in Washington are ill-equipped to effectively comply with social distancing and other public health requirements and therefore continued in-person court appearances jeopardize the health and safety of litigants, attorneys, judges, court staff, and members of the public: and

WHEREAS, pursuant to this Court's prior orders, the stakeholders in the justice system have taken important steps to protect public health while ensuring continued access to justice and essential court services, including by strictly observing social distancing measures, holding proceedings remotely, suspending many in-building operations, and promulgating emergency rules as necessary; and

WHEREAS, given the significant number of identified and projected COVID-19 cases in Washington State, the severity of the risk posed to the public, court personnel and litigants, and the child care needs of potential jurors, witnesses, and other parties, and based upon the consistent and urgent advice of all public health experts that use of facial coverings and proactive "social distancing" and limiting public gatherings is essential to address the emergent healthcare concerns brought on by the COVID-19 outbreak; and

WHEREAS, on July 24, 2020, Governor Inslee instituted additional restrictions regarding use of facemasks, and limitations on gatherings related to businesses.

Governor Inslee further indicated that further restrictions could be forthcoming due to the increase in COVID-19 cases occurring in Washington State; and

WHEREAS, on July 28, 2020, Governor Inlsee indefinitely paused reopenings for all counties under the "Safe Start – Stay Healthy" County by County Phased Reopening proclamation. Klickitat County is currently still in Phase 2. Governor Inslee has threatened additional rollbacks and potentially issuing another stay at home order if the number of cases continue to rise; and

WHEREAS, as of October 20, 2020, the Washington State Department of Health shows that Klickitat County has had 206 cases, 12 hospitalizations and 3 deaths; and

WHEREAS the Klickitat County Commissioners have closed the Klickitat County Courthouse to the public due to COVID-19 concerns, which is still in effect. Klickitat County has indicated that the outside doors to the courthouse will continue to be locked to the general public until the county is in Phase 3 of the reopening process;

WHEREAS as limited options exist within Klickitat exist to safely gather large groups of potential jurors to allow for proper social distancing; and

WHEREAS, the courtrooms, jury rooms and other areas of the courthouse in Klickitat are currently being remodeled and updated to insure safety for all persons that come into the courtroom, jury room and other areas of the courthouse, including the purchasing and acquisition of additional safety equipment; and

WHEREAS, on September 10, 2020, the Washington State Supreme Court entered an order excluding speedy trial time through a defendant's next scheduled court date after October 15, 2020; and

WHEREAS, on October 13, 2020, the Washington State Supreme Court entered an order again indicating that speedy trial time on all cases is excluded through defendant's next schedule court date after October 15, 2020 and furthermore after October 15, 2020 the court could exclude time under these rules based on individual findings of unavoidable circumstances due to COVID-19 or other circumstances; and

WHEREAS the court was advised on October 16, 2020 that a COVID-19 infected individual was checked into the Klickitat County Jail and that potential exposure had occurred to corrections staff and law enforcement; and

WHEREAS the court finds that due to the fact that the Klickitat County outside courthouse doors continue to be closed to the general public until the county reaches phase 3; the continued increase in number of cases during the past month which showed a 7 day rolling average of 351 cases in Washington State on 9/12/2020 to a 7 day rolling average of 578 cases in Washington State on 10/8/2020; the limitation on a safe and suitable space to gather a sufficient number of jurors; and recent safety concerns related to a COVID-19 exposure at the local jail; that the COVID-19 pandemic within Klickitat County continues to present an unavoidable circumstance to safely and effectively hold jury trials until the county reaches at least phase 3 of the statewide reopening process. This is an individualized determination that an unavoidable circumstance exists due to COVID-19 that the speedy trial time for the currently pending jury trials in Klickitat County shall be as ordered below:

It is hereby ORDERED, pursuant to the authority of Washington State Supreme
Court Orders related to court operations during the COVID-19 pandemic and the
authority as the Presiding Judge of both the Klickitat County Superior Courts, as follows:

## **CRIMINAL CASES:**

- 1. A. <u>Klickitat County Superior Court</u>. All jury trials in Klickitat County
  Superior Court are suspended until at least January 1, 2021 or the county
  reaches Phase 3 of the "Safe Start Stay Healthy" County by County Phased
  Reopening Proclamation, whichever occurs last. If the county is still not in Phase
  3 of the reopening process on January 1, 2021, the court shall reissue an
  emergency order to address the court dates that are outlined below.
- 2. A. <u>Klickitat County Superior Court</u>. Jury trials scheduled in Klickitat County Superior Court for November 4, 2020, November 18, 2020, December 9, 2020 and December 23, 2020 shall be continued until after January 1, 2021 as follows:
- (i) <u>IN-CUSTODY</u> persons in-custody as of October 22, 2020 shall have their jury trials continued to January 20, 2021, with a status conference scheduled for January 4, 2021 at 10:00 AM, final review scheduled for January 19, 2021 at 9:00 AM and jury trial scheduled for January 20, 2021 at 8:15 AM;
- (ii) <u>OUT-OF-CUSTODY</u> persons out-of-custody as of October 22, 2020 shall have their jury trials continued to February 3, 2021, with a status conference scheduled for January 19, 2021 at 10:00 AM, final review scheduled for February 1, 2021 at 9:00 AM and jury trial scheduled for February 3, 2021 at 8:15 AM.
- (iii) NEW CASES ARISING AFTER OCTOBER 22, 2020 any person charged with a crime after October 22, 2020 shall have their court date scheduled pursuant to whether in-custody or out-of-custody as of their arraignment date. Persons in-custody as of their arraignment shall be scheduled

as follows: status conference scheduled for January 4, 2021 at 10:00 AM, final review scheduled for January 19, 2021 at 9:00 AM and jury trial scheduled for January 20, 2021 at 8:15 AM. Persons <u>out-of-custody</u> as of their arraignment shall be scheduled as follows: status conference scheduled for January 19, 2021 at 10:00 AM, final review scheduled for February 1, 2021 at 9:00 AM and jury trial scheduled for February 3, 2021 at 8:15 AM

3. A. Klickitat County Superior Court. A continuance of criminal trials for cases filed in Klickitat County Superior Court is required in the administration of justice. Based upon this court's finding that the serious danger posed by COVID-19 is good cause to continue criminal jury trials, and constitutes an unavoidable circumstance under CrR 3.3(e)(8) & CrRLJ 3.3(e)(8), the time between March 18, 2020 and January 1, 2021 (or the defendant's next scheduled court hearing after October 15, 2020, whichever is later) shall be EXCLUDED when calculating time for trial. CrR 3.3(e)(3) & CrRLJ 3.3(e)(3).

## 4. <u>NON-JURY TRIALS</u>

All non-jury trials may be scheduled prior to January 1, 2021 after consultation with the court administrator. The court administrator may schedule non-jury trials upon consultation with all parties and providing both parties at least 2 weeks advance notice of any trial date.

5. All status conferences and final reviews scheduled prior to January 1, 2021 shall be stricken. Omnibus hearings scheduled prior to January 1, 2021 shall continue to be held. Defendants shall not be required to appear for any omnibus hearing, status conference hearing or final review hearing that is

scheduled prior to January 1, 2021. Counsel for defendants are responsible for advising defendants of any new court dates.

6. Motion hearings, omnibus hearings, and change of plea hearings may continue to be scheduled prior to January 1, 2021.
