| Morning Workshop Session – Tuesday, June 22, 2021 | Chairman David M. Sauter called the meeting to order at 9:30 AM. Commissioners present: David M. Sauter (attended via zoom), Jacob L. Anderson, and Dan Christopher in the Chambers. |

| Issues as determined by the Board of Commissioners | <p>Chairman David Sauter thanked his seatmates for the discussion before he is on leave, noting since the Board members are not able to discuss topics outside of a meeting this is an important topic he would like to open the discussion regarding Sheriff Bob Songer’s Public Notice that was released June 16, 2021.</p> <p>Chairman Sauter stated the press releases were not acceptable in his eyes, due to the threats that were listed or implied in the release in regards to the Public Health Department employees as well other Departments listed.</p> <p>Commissioner Anderson and Christopher stated they are in support of a joint letter from the board to Sheriff Songer addressing the ambiguous wording in his letter. Commissioner Anderson stated that we have three branches of government for a reason and the legislators make the laws, the executive branch carries out the law, and the judicial branch interprets the law.</p> <p>Prosecuting Attorney David Quesnel stated he appreciates the statements made by the Board and has taken extra precocious due to this press release. Prosecutor Quesnel expressed concern and stated the press release does not sit well with him personally or professionally.</p> <p>Prosecutor Quesnel inquired if the Board has considered changing the oversight of the jail due to the safety concerns as well as the oversight of the Sheriff’s Department.</p> <p>Commissioner Christopher read a letter he had drafted in response to the Sheriff’s Press Release, followed by a discussion by the Board to use his letter as a basis for a joint letter.</p> <p>Public Health Director Erinn Quinn thanked the Commissioners for their response and addressing the issues written in the Sheriff’s Press Release.</p> <p>Prosecutor Quesnel read a statement in response to the Press Release from Sheriff Songer, noting he will continue to follow the rule of law.</p> <p>Public Health Board Member Sue Pennington thanked the Board for their support and will continue to support the Public Health Department.</p> <p>The Board held further discussion regarding how to proceed from here.</p> <p>Chairman Sauter left the meeting at 10:03 AM.</p> |

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| Public Works/Road Department Update | <p>10:00 AM – Public Works Department Update</p> <p>Attendance: Public Works Director Gordon Kelsey, Public Works Deputy Director Jeff Hunter in the Chambers, various county employees, and residents via telephone.</p> <p>Public Works Director Gordon Kelsey reported on the Consent Agenda items this afternoon, noting the rejection of all bids is within the right of the contracting agency to reject all the bids. Director Kelsey stated they will be re-advertising and the bid opening will be on July 20, 2021.</p> <p>Director Kelsey reported the contractor is striping on the west side today and will stripe Alderdale Road, followed by a discussion of the water-born versus low VOC paint for striping.</p> <p>Director Kelsey stated the east end crew is grading and patching the roads, starting with the Bickleton Highway; the west crew is grading, mowing, and patching.</p> <p>A report was provided on the Klickitat County Services Building and inquired if the Commissioners would like to view the building next week, noting there is a lot of progress.</p> <p>Director Kelsey advised the Fairgrounds received their new announcement equipment and it will be installed before the fair, followed by an update on the Pioneer Center repainting job.</p> <p>Director Kelsey reported on the Courthouse entry project noting they are not taking out more entrances than one at a time and the contractor is ready to pour the east entrance, the American Disabilities Act ramp is ready to receive the heat wires and a portion of the south sidewalk is being replaced; the east entrance will be poured next week, noting the handrail is being built offsite.</p> <p>Director Kelsey stated he met with the Trout Lake Park Community regarding the Park improvements and possible grants the community is looking into for the revision of the water lines and installing frost-free lines, noting they are buried very shallowly and will freeze easily. Director Kelsey stated the community is interested in new playground equipment, noting some of the grants are a 50% match.</p> <p>A brief discussion was held as to how much it will cost to dig through the basalt to install the water lines and how much the Trout Lake Park grosses yearly.</p> <p>Director Kelsey reported there was a request to lower the speed on Lake Road and a request for a revision from the Department of Natural Resources to not allow people to drive to the end of the road, noting there is not a lake at the end of the road and it is causing a lot of misrepresentation.</p> |

Attendance: Human Resources/Administrative Services Director Robb Van Cleave, Administrative Services Fiscal Manager Jenn Bartley, Department of Emergency Director Jeff King, Chief Deputy Auditor Heather Jobe, Treasurer Greg Gallagher in the Chambers, various county employees and residents via telephone.

Human Resources/Administrative Services Director Robb Van Cleave reported the Clerical Administrative position in the Human Resource Department has been filled by Sandy Christopher.

Director Van Cleave requested and received verbal approval to advertise a Department of Emergency Management, Casual Communications Officer, noting the current casual Communications Officer excepted full-time employment, as well as a requested verbal approval to proceed with the internal advertising process of a Clerical Administration II in the Elections Department within the Auditor's Office.

Director Van Cleave stated the Student Intern Program is moving forward and an application review will be next week.

Director Van Cleave stated he met with the Employee Salary Survey team and they anticipate the survey being completed in October so the Board can review and make a decision before the 2022, budget year.

Director Van Cleave reported an Information Technology employee has come forward and stated interested in being in charge of the County website versus hiring a webmaster. The Board was in support.

Director Van Cleave stated there are numerous security risks to the County through the various items that are required to be connected to the internet. Director Van Cleave stated he will provide further follow-up regarding the different services available to provide network security for the County.

Fiscal Manager Jenn Bartley reported on the COVID-19 funds received, followed by a request for direction regarding advice to provide to the Offices and Departments regarding a status quo budget for 2022.

Director Van Cleave reported on the Offices and Department's historical budgets, noting all the budget predictions have been fair so far.

A brief discussion was held regarding the County's Financial System and if there are any items to add to the upcoming joint meeting with Skamania County Commissioners.

Treasurer Greg Gallagher reported the timber money will get allocated the same way the taxes get allocated, the State will take their 25%, followed by the Junior Taxing Districts and the schools.

A discussion followed regarding the letter from the Board addressing Sheriff Bob Songer's press release last week.

| Comments will be limited to seven (7) minutes per individual | | Janet Eshley from White Salmon stated her concerns about Sheriff Bob Songer's statement in the Gorge News regarding his religious beliefs and understanding of the Constitution, noting she feels threatened by his statements. The Board stated later in the meeting under Board Pending there will be a letter addressing the concerns the Board has. Goldendale resident Greg Wagner from C.E.A.S.E inquired how the Board knows about solar projects on Knight Road since no application has been received, Mr. Wagner stated the Solar Moratorium should not have been allowed due to the Commissioner's not knowing about the possibility of a solar farm in the Knight Road area. Gabrielle Gilbert stated the proclamation written by Sheriff Songer written on June 17 th needs to have separation of God and State, stating she is not paying tax dollars to support the statements made by Sheriff Songer. Sheri Bousquet stated she would like to continue the conversation regarding the Conditional Use Permit Process and would like to know how to allow the permits to work for the County citizens and would like to educate herself on the process. Ms. Bousquet stated she has been reading and inquired about the resolution regarding the Knight Road Project and the process that the project will follow. Ms. Bousquet recited County Code, 19.60.090 Conditional Use Permit notice of time and place of hearing, followed by inquiring about what is the application phase when a developer comes to the Planning Department, what is considered an application? |

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| | <p>Vice-Chairman Anderson stated a completed application has to be accepted before an application phase can begin. Commissioner Christopher reviewed how a submittal of an application is turned in.</p> <p>Commissioner Christopher reviewed the submittal of the application process, noting there can be no hearing until an application is submitted. The Planning Department will review the application before it goes to the Board of Adjustment.</p> <p>Vern Harpole from Lyle retired Public Health Officer commended the Public Health Department and would like to minimize the controversy regarding Sheriff Bob Songer's Public Notice change the focus and encourage the Commissioners to celebrate the way County the COVID-19 vaccinations were given, noting the H1N1 vaccinations were not given as much as the COVID-19 Vaccine and were not nearly as successful as the vaccinations in the County for the COVID-19 Vaccine.</p> <p>Lynn Mason stated she thanked the Public Health Department for the way the vaccinations were done in Klickitat County and it far surpassed her expectations and wanted to thank the Public Health Department and their staff efforts to make the process as positive as possible. Ms. Mason stated she does not agree with Mr. Harpole as he is stating we should keep things positive.</p> <p>Ms. Mason stated Sheriff Bob Songer is involved with people that are considered domestic terrorists and does not support the Sheriff's proclamation. Ms. Mason stated there needs to be a separation of God and State.</p> <p>A discussion followed regarding the Zoom format and the ease of constituents reaching out to the Commissioners.</p> <p>Vern Harpole thanked Lynn Mason, noting he is usually a very angry and upset person but is being positive, and thanked her for her comments.</p> |

| <p>Joint Meeting between Skamania & Klickitat County Commissioners, Thursday, June 24, 2021</p> | <p>Skamania County Chairman Tom Lannen opened the Skamania County Commissioners meeting and Vice-Chairman Jacob Anderson convened the Klickitat County Commissioners meeting at 1:00 PM at Hegewald Center Auditorium in Stevenson WA. Skamania County Commissioners Richard Mahar and Bob Hamlin, and Klickitat County Commissioners Jacob Anderson and Dan Christopher were present. David Sauter was absent due to a previously scheduled event. Also in attendance were Klickitat County Economic Development/Natural Resources Director Dave McClure, EDC Executive Director Kevin Waters, and Staci Patton, West End resident.</p> <p>Present on Zoom: Klickitat County Chief Deputy Auditor Heather Jobe, Senior Services Director Sharon Carter and Chief of Operations Norma Pickett, Treasurer Greg Gallagher, and Fiscal Manager Jenn Bartley; Skamania County Senior Services Program Manager Sophie Miller and several county residents.</p> <p>The Skamania and Klickitat County Commissioners met to discuss various matters that affect both counties. The first topic of discussion was the Department of Natural</p> |

Resources (DNR) management of trust lands and timber revenues. Commissioner Tom Lannen who serves as the chairman of the Timber Counties Caucus provided an overview of the Caucus' priorities and activities, which focuses on ways to create and sustain revenues for timber counties. Discussion followed regarding legislative and proposed DNR management changes for county trust lands.

Discussion followed regarding computer systems, software programs, websites, and security measures used by both counties. The commissioners discussed how important the correct financial software systems are and how they can help increase efficiencies and productivity.

The Commissioners discussed increases in tourism/visitors and issues that can arise, such as crowded parking areas at trailheads, traffic accidents and congestion on SR 14, and needed road maintenance.

The discussion moved to wildfire prevention. Chairman Lannen asked the Klickitat Commissioners if the county would be interested in joining them in a fire prevention signage project. The Underwood Conservation District is also involved in the project and will be having fire prevention signs printed. The signs are small and can be placed on road signs to remind the public to be mindful of fire dangers. The Klickitat Commissioners agreed to participate.


The conversation turned to Gorge 2020 and Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area issues, which included how the Gorge 2020 plan will affect short-term rentals and affordable housing. The commissioners discussed the sale of SDS properties and how it can and will affect both counties. The commissioners also shared their thoughts on counties purchasing large parcels of land and the Northwestern Lake property and potential buyers.

Discussion continued concerning wildfire and wildland/urban interface and how some areas are changing their building code to require fire protection to be built into building materials and landscaping designs.

Discussion regarding how the counties plan to use Federal COVID Relief funding followed. Commissioner Anderson noted that Klickitat elected officials and department heads chose new finance software as the top priority. The commissioners also placed the purchase of body cams for patrol and corrections officers as a top priority. Gorge Act funding was also discussed. Skamania EDC Executive Director Kevin Waters shared his thoughts on the Scenic Act and encouraged the Klickitat Commissioners to sign on to the act.

The Skamania Commissioners shared their thoughts on the housing authority's assisted living facility, noting that there is a shortfall of \$3 million in funding. Commissioner Anderson noted that Klickitat County has already contributed greatly by purchasing the property where the facility is being built in White Salmon.

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| | <p>The Commissioners discussed the lack of affordable workforce housing, economic development, and growth of various communities in both counties. Discussion followed concerning the Columbia Gorge Regional Airport. Commissioner Anderson provided a brief update on the airport, noting their focus is on expanding the business park.</p> <p>The Commissioners discussed public records requests. Skamania County Clerk of the Board Debbie Slack provided an overview of their software tracking system and how the County's Deputy Prosecutor manages public records requests. Commissioners Anderson and Christopher provided an update on the new County Services Building.</p> <p>The condition and maintenance of SR 14 were discussed. Commissioner Anderson noted that there have been many accidents due to people trying to turn off the highway to reach trailheads. Commissioner Christopher indicated that tourism is the biggest impact on SR 14 in Klickitat County. The Skamania Commissioners indicated that they are seeing more settling of the highway.</p> <p>Commissioner Anderson raised the issue of the cost to counties for providing search and rescue services. The commissioners shared potential options to fund search & rescue services, such as adding fees to hunting and fishing licenses, recreational permits, taxing the manufactures of recreational vehicles/equipment, or propose legislation to fund local search & rescue options.</p> <p>Chairman Lannen opened the meeting for citizen comments. Klickitat County Economic Development Director McClure commented on a new Small Business Development Center, which is a partnership with Washington State University and Skamania County Economic Development Council. The Commissioners all expressed their support to work together on matters that affect both counties.</p> |
