






Blood lead testing in Washington

THE FACTS*


 <p>62% Homes built before 1978</p>	 <p>27,000 Homes with lead service lines</p>	<p>Who is NOT getting tested?</p>  <p>Nationally 76% 1- & 2-year-olds MISSED</p> <p><i>(Based on Medicaid requirements & EPSDT reports)</i></p>
 <p>302,779 Children living in these homes</p>		

REIMBURSEMENT



LeadCare II is reimbursable with CPT code 83655.

BEST PRACTICE



Test all children at ages 1 and again at age 2; or up to age 6, if they have not previously been tested.

Test pregnant and lactating women when a single factor is present.

High-risk populations required to test

- All Medicaid children at age 1 and age 2; or up to age 6, if they have not previously been tested.
- All children prior to Head Start enrollment.

Is LeadCare II right for your practice?
